CITY OF LOS ANGELES
HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION AND RAPID REHOUSING PROGRAM (HPRP)

HPRP was created as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009, by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). HPRP is a short-term assistance program that, unfortunately, will not be able to help everyone who is homeless or at risk of eviction. It cannot be used for mortgage payments. Priority must be given to households who are most in need of this temporary assistance and who are most likely to achieve stable housing after the HPRP assistance has ended. The program has strict rules which must be followed. The City of Los Angeles HPRP will start operations on Monday, November 2, 2009.

What you should know about the City of Los Angeles Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program:

1. You must currently live in the City of Los Angeles to be a client of this program.
2. You must be homeless or at risk of homelessness, with no alternative housing options, financial resources or support networks to help you find housing or stay in your current home.
3. There are two parts to the program: homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing.
4. Your current income must not exceed the amounts in the table below.

HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION ASSISTANCE

If you, as an individual or family, meet the requirements above, are a renter facing eviction and have received an Unlawful Detainer (UD) from your landlord, you **may** be eligible for legal services, supportive services and/or other assistance to help you stay in your current home.

RAPID RE-HOUSING ASSISTANCE

If you, as an individual or family, meet the requirements above and are homeless, you **may** be eligible for housing locator and supportive services and financial assistance (first month's rent and security deposit) to help you move into a rental home. Also, if you are a homeowner losing your home to foreclosure in the City of Los Angeles and have received an official notice of sale which contains the time and location of the foreclosure sale, and other details, and you meet the requirements above, you **may** be eligible for housing locator and supportive services and financial assistance (first month's rent and security deposit) to help you move into a new home.
